God is faithful

- Not tempted above what you are able
- Will make a way of escape
- That you may be able to bear it

- Let's begin by noticing characteristics of mature people
 - Planning
 - Making commitments
 - Displaying patience
 - Not a quitting lifestyle
- Yet, the Bible shows – there are times to leave bad situations
- Foundational scripture – let us look at a verse about dealing with the subject of slavery

1 Cor. 7:21

called while a slave? – if you can be made free, use it

James Moffatt translation – “Everyone must remain in the condition of life where he was called. You were a slave when you were called? Never mind. Of course, if you do find it possible to get free, you had better avail yourself of the opportunity.”

- Consider 4 situations of leaving – listed here in reverse order from previous presentations about this subject – listed in order of hardest to easiest – to not shortchange the hardest

1. Leaving a marriage	3. Leaving a job
2. Leaving a country	4. Leaving a church organization

1. Leaving a marriage

Marriage commitment is special – this situation is more serious than the next 3 examples

Reminder – please, do NOT be quick to leave a marriage

Reminder – please, be kind to those in bad situations – remember that there are Biblical reasons

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including Matthew 5:31-32; Matthew 19:3-9; and 1 Corinthians 7:6-15

- It is not necessarily a sin to leave a marriage

Jer. 3:8	I put her away and gave her a certificate of divorce
Mal. 2:16	the Lord God of Israel says that He hates divorce
1 Cor. 7:6-15	Paul's 3 categories
10-11	divorce is not necessarily forbidden – remarriage is the issue

2. Leaving a country

Is there ever a time to leave a country?

Instead of grumbling, how can you improve your situation?

Gen. 12:1-5	God instructed Abram – “get out of your country”
Gen. 13:12	Abram and Lot separated
Gen. 19:15-22	angels urged Lot to leave – “hurry, escape”
Exod. 12:33-39	urgent – to get them out in haste
Matt. 2:12-15	Joseph & family temporarily left their country
Matt. 24:15-18	abomination of desolation – those in Judea, “flee”

3. Leaving a job

Is there ever a time to leave a job?

Instead of grumbling, how can you improve your situation?

For the record – my personal world-view is living 70 years in a Constitutional Republic (U.S.)
 Consider good advice – continue developing various practical skills can help a person find a job
 Consider good advice – don't rush out of a job, until you have a new job lined up

4. Leaving a church organization

Is there ever a time for a person to leave a church organization?

Instead of grumbling, how can you improve your situation?

Remember – some church organizations practice control techniques – equating exclusive association with their physical group as membership in the Spiritual Body of Christ

Leaving a church organization is NOT the same as leaving the Living God

Leaving a church organization is NOT the same as leaving the Spiritual Body of Christ

2 Thes. 3:6	withdraw from disorderly people – (context is apparent leaders)
1 Tim. 6:3-5	withdraw from an unhealthy people – (context is apparent leaders)
Acts 15:36-40	temporarily preached separately
