- Title Philippians 4:13 Part 4
- Why would a pastor make a series around those words?
 - 1. I believe that a merciful Heavenly Father readily answers prayers
 - 2. But I do not believe in the "name-it, claim-it" approach where people can push God to do what they want Him to do and cause Him to submit to them
 - 3. Our loving Father gives us so much every need and many of our wants
 - 4. One of the greatest gifts a dad gives to his children is a can-do, positive attitude and the perfect Heavenly Father does the same He helps us to succeed through adversity
- In two recent studies I invited you to consider the following 3 concepts
 - 1. God supplies our personal needs
 - 2. God will often give us the desires of our heart
 - 3. God sometimes says "no" to our requests
- At the end of the last study I mentioned the following
 - When a loving Father says "no" –

He wants us to grow and to learn He will teach us how to endure He will teach us how to succeed
