New prayer requests

Marie Hirschler of Council Bluffs, Iowa (widow of **Vince Hirschler**), received biopsy results. Following are excerpts from an update: "It was not what I was hoping for. Both the nodule on the thyroid and the lump are malignant papillary thyroid carcinoma. Though this feels a bit surreal, I have had relative peace. The doctor was quick to recommend surgery for the removal of the thyroid and the tumor in the neck. I have not decided to go that route. I ask for continued prayers."

Doris Cole of Happy Camp, Ore., has been dealing with eye problems. Following are excerpts of a report from Mrs. Cole: "Last week I began losing my eyesight for about 15 to 20 minutes at a time. This was happening several times a day. After going to my eye doctor and primary-care doctor, I have been diagnosed with giant-cell arteritis, also known as temporal arteritis. It causes an inflammation of the large blood vessels and temporal artery. If left untreated it can lead to permanent blindness or aneurysm. My inflammation-test results went from level 2 last Friday to level 9 yesterday. My doctor called early this morning with the result and said I needed to start treatment immediately. The only treatment is large doses of steroids, which I started today. I will see a rheumatologist on Monday and they will probably do further testing."

Ernest Herzogenrath of Dormagen, Germany, has been diagnosed with cancer in his right upper jawbone. Following are excerpts from an update: "Doctors are recommending that this portion of the bone along with two teeth in the front area have to be completely removed. The exposed area will be covered with a skin transplant from the forearm. In addition, the lymph nodes on the right side will be removed and a tracheostomy will be necessary for the operation to be performed." The operation is scheduled for May 18 and will take about seven hours.

Relpha T. Sablas, who is a nurse at the National Health Service hospital in London, England, has been adversely affected by coronavirus due to the high incidence in her work area.

Manfred Meier of Moosdorf, Austria, died on May 2. Please remember his wife, **Ursula**, and the rest of the family in your prayers.

Father's Expectations—1 Corinthians 10:6-11

BIG SANDY, Texas—Recently, I have been talking to my friends about our Heavenly Father's expectations for us—because He is a God of mercy.

On the first day of Unleavened Bread (Thursday, April 9), I gave a Bible study titled "What Are the Father's Expectations?" The purpose of the presentation was twofold.

- I wanted to remind friends that a God of grace has expectations for His children.
- I wanted to remind friends that the Bible contains many, many examples of the Father's expectations.

Let's notice a few of those expectations by looking at 1 Corinthians 10:6-11.

Although the text describes five characteristics that the apostle Paul discouraged, we can also recognize five characteristics that Paul recommends.

Be content

Paul mentioned that the Israelites lusted after evil things. Many Bible students believe that he was referring to Numbers 11:4-6.

Paul taught disciples in Philippi to be content. See Philippians 4:11-13.

Avoid idolatry

Paul mentioned that the Israelites were idolaters. He directly referred to Exodus 32:6.

What is noteworthy to me is how Aaron sought to justify his involvement by blaming the people and reporting the occurrence of a supernatural event.

Exodus 32:22-24—"So Aaron said, 'Do not let the anger of my lord become hot. You know the people, that they are set on evil. For they said to me, "Make us gods that shall go before us; as for this Moses, the man who brought us out of the land of Egypt, we do not know what has become of him." And I said to them, "Whoever has any gold, let them break it off." So they gave it to me, and I cast it into the fire, and this calf came out."

Paul recognized and complimented disciples in Thessalonica for turning from idols to serve the living God. See 1 Thessalonians 1:9.

Avoid sexual immorality

Paul mentioned that the Israelites committed sexual immorality. He directly referred to Numbers 25:1-9.

Paul taught the disciples in Corinth to avoid sexual immorality. See 1 Corinthians 6:15-20.

Trust the Lord

Paul mentioned that Israelites "tempted Christ." What does that even mean?

Here are how some other translations word the phrase "tempted Christ."

- Moffatt translation—Not presume upon the Lord
- New American Standard Bible—Not try the Lord
- Revised Standard Version—Not put the Lord to the test
- The New Testament in the Language of Today—Not go too far in testing the Lord's patience

Paul directly referred to Numbers 21:5-6. Instead of mentioning one of Paul's instructions here, I want to remind you about one of the three temptations of the Son of God. See Matthew 4:6-7.

Recognize your blessings

Paul mentioned that the Israelites complained against God. He directly referred to Numbers 14:2-37.

Paul taught disciples in Philippi to recognize their blessings and to focus on the positive. See Philippians 4:8.

Written for us

1 Corinthians 10:11—"Now all these things happened to them as examples, and they were written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the ages have come."
