"The Eighth Commandment"

BIG SANDY, Texas—At our Bible study on Wednesday night, I gave a presentation titled "The Eighth Commandment." Following are some of the scriptures that I read.

Grace and expectations

Exodus 20:2—"I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage."

Exodus 20:15—"You shall not steal."

Five concepts

In the Bible-study presentation, I organized my material into five concepts. In this article, I will refer to those five different concepts.

Stealing things, including money

- Exodus 22:1—What if a person stole an ox or sheep?
- Exodus 22:2-3—A difference if the thief was killed during a day burglary or a night burglary.
- Exodus 22:4—If a thief was caught with the animals alive, he paid the owner double.
- Exodus 22:5—If an animal grazed in another man's field, the owner made restitution from the best of his own field and best of his own vineyard.
- Leviticus 19:11—You shall not steal, nor deal falsely.
- Leviticus 19:13—You shall not cheat your neighbor, or rob him.
- Isaiah 1:23-24—God will take vengeance on a companion of thieves.
- Jeremiah 7:9-16—When a person committed sins (including stealing), he lost favor in the temple.
- Hosea 4:1-3—Sins in the land (including stealing) caused mourning in the land.
- Zechariah 5:3—In a vision, there was a flying scroll with a curse that was written: "Every thief shall be expelled."
- Malachi 3:8-10—Will a person rob God?
- Luke 3:12-13—The Son of God told the tax collectors: "Collect no more than what is appointed for you."
- Luke 3:14—The Son of God told the soldiers: "Be content with your wages."
- John 18:40—Barabbas was a robber.
- Romans 13:7—Pay what you owe.

- 1 Corinthians 5:11—Disciples should avoid a brother who is an extortioner.
- 1 Corinthians 6:9-10—Thieves shall not inherit the Kingdom of God.

Kidnapping is stealing people

- Exodus 21:16—A kidnapper shall surely be put to death.
- Deuteronomy 24:7—A kidnapper shall die.
- 1 Timothy 1:9-10—The law was not made for a righteous person, but for the lawless and sinner—one of the sins listed was kidnapping.

Stealing civil freedom

- 1 Samuel 8:1-22—When Israel wanted a king, God warned the Israelites that the civil leaders would steal from them.
- *Matthew 20:25-28*—The Son of God warned about civil rulers wanting to lord it over people and to exercise authority over people.

Stealing religious freedom

- 2 Corinthians 11:20—Some of the disciples were allowing religious leaders to do the following: place in bondage, devour, steal, exalt over and hit.
- John 2:14-16—The Son of God corrected people who were making the Father's house into a house of merchandise (using religion to take money from the people).
- Matthew 21:12-13—When the Son of God corrected the people who were making the Father's house into a place of business, He quoted Isaiah 56:7 (about a house of prayer for all people) and called them a "den of thieves."
- *Matthew 23:4-12*—The Son of God saw the religious leaders putting heavy burdens on the people and elevating their own importance.
- Revelation 3:11—The Son of God warned disciples to not allow anyone (including religious leaders) to take their crown.

Stealing truth—by stealing God's name and His credibility

• Jeremiah 23:30-31—The Lord is against the prophets who "steal My

words"—by falsely attributing those words to God.

- John 10:1-8—Some among the flock are thieves and robbers.
- *John 10:10*—The thief comes to steal, to kill and to destroy.
- 2 Peter 2:1-3—False teachers steal truth, often because of covetousness—having a desire for power and money.
