Prayer updates

In the April 12 and April 19 bulletins, we mentioned that **Jon Swenson** of Coatesville, Ind., had an accident with a table saw that required surgery for a damaged thumb. On Wednesday, his wife reported: "Jon's radial flap is no longer soft. It is hard. We will be calling the doctor tomorrow." On Thursday, she reported: "The doctor finally called back about Jon's hand. His flap is not a free flap, so she really doesn't believe it's a blood clot causing the hardening of the flap. The whole hand team agrees at this point. On Monday, they are going to do an office procedure to start removing some of the biologic (the black stuff) and hope there's good skin under there. If not, they will do another graft early next week."

New prayer requests

On Monday, **Linda Moers** (of Crockett) reported: "I am requesting prayers for a problem with vocal-cord paralysis that I am experiencing. It affects not only my voice, but, more importantly, my breathing. My doctor ordered CT scans of my neck and chest. They showed my airway is being restricted to 4 mm when the normal is around 10 to 15. I'm on my way to see my ENT [ear, nose and throat doctor] regarding my scans. He has referred me to see a laryngologist, but I can't see him until June 4. Right now, I am concerned about my airway. I would very much appreciate prayers." On Thursday, Mrs. Moers reported: "I followed up with my ENT. Even though my airway is at 4 mm, he feels that it (in his words) should be 'sufficient.' He wouldn't want me to get a respiratory infection or in an accident that could cause any more swelling. If I were to have any trouble breathing, I should let someone know immediately. He thinks that the wait to see the laryngologist on June 4 should not be a problem. I still do not have my voice, and I get out of breath when I try to talk. Thank everyone for the prayers."

On Monday, **Amy Case** reported about her **Aunt Linda** of Leverett's Chapel: "Over the weekend, my Aunt Linda fell from a deck about 10 feet. (The railing on the deck was old and gave way.) She broke her neck in two places, as well as two vertebrae in her back. She has multiple other injuries as well. She would appreciate prayer while she is awaiting a trauma surgeon." On Thursday, Mrs. Case reported: "Aunt Linda has been moved to the cardiac unit. She is in a neck brace for 12 to 14 weeks. Since her back was just cracked (and not broken), she is wearing a back brace. They are trying to keep her immobile. Now, her heart is not in the right rhythm and her blood pressure keeps spiking. She's undergoing more tests, an MRI and a heart cath today."

On Tuesday, **Randy Wallace** of Iowa (ex–son-in-law of **Vonda Ouellette**) had a heart attack. On Thursday, he was scheduled for open-heart surgery.

On Wednesday, **Angela Dunnam** reported on the text line: "**Timberly** has had a very rough day with kidney-stone pain and can't get any relief. She asked if I would let you and **Pam** know." On Thursday, Mrs. Dunnam reported: "We wanted to thank everyone for the prayers for Timberly. She is having relief today and is doing better this afternoon."

B IG SANDY, Texas—At our Bible study on Wednesday night, I began a new series. The topic is the Ten Commandments. The presentation was titled "First Commandment—Part 1." (The plan is for most of the Commandments to have their own individual Bible studies, but I wanted to pay extra attention to the First Commandment.

Foundational scripture

■ Exodus 20:2—"I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage."

Then, the Lord proceeded to remind the children of Israel about the Ten Commandments.

Old Testament lesson = After God delivered them from Egypt, He reminded them of His expectations from them.

New Testament lesson = When God offers His bountiful grace to New Testament disciples, He still has expectations of them (Romans 6:1-2, Ephesians 2:8-10 and Titus 3:4-8).

God's creation

■ Genesis 1:1—In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth.

■ Genesis 1:3-5—During the first day, God created light and darkness ("Day" and "Night").

Genesis 1:6-8—During the second day, God created a firmament in the midst of the water, calling the firmament "Heaven."

Genesis 1:9-13—During the third day, God created dry land among the water, calling the land and water "Earth" and "Seas" then creating the earth to produce grass, seed and fruit.

Genesis 1:14-19—During the fourth day, God created two great lights in the firmament (the sun and moon), and He also made the stars.

Genesis 1:20-23—During the fifth day, God created living creatures (birds and sea creatures).

Genesis 1:24-31—During the sixth day, God created more living creatures—highlighting people, whom He gave dominion over the other aspects of His creation.

■ Genesis 2:1-3—During the seventh day, God rested and blessed the seventh day.

Genesis 2:18-25—In these verses, God gave more details about the creation of the woman from the man's rib.

Two references about altars

Genesis 8:20—This is the first reference about an "altar"—describing where Noah built an altar to the Lord.

Genesis 35:1-2—Later, we read how God instructed Jacob to build an altar to God and how Jacob instructed His household: "Put away the foreign gods that are among you."

Abraham, Isaac and Jacob

Let's notice verses in the Old Testament about the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

■ Genesis 12:1-3—God made a promise to Abram.

Genesis 17:1-14—God changed Abram's name to Abraham and made a covenant with him.

■ Genesis 22:15-18—God repeated His promise to Abraham.

■ Genesis 26:2-5—God repeated His promise to Isaac.

■ Genesis 28:10-15—God repeated His promise to Jacob.

■ Exodus 3:6—The Lord said: "I am the God of your father—the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob."

■ Exodus 3:14—God said to Moses: "I AM WHO I AM."

Exodus 3:15—God told to Moses to tell the children of Israel: "The LORD God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob has sent me to you. This is My name forever, and this is My memorial to all generations."

■ Exodus 3:16—God told Moses to gather the elders of Israel and to tell them: "The LORD God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, of Isaac and of Jacob appeared to me."

Exodus 3:6 in John 8

■ John 8:53—The Jews asked the Son of God: "Are you greater than our father Abraham?"

■ John 8:56—The Son of God responded: "Your father Abraham rejoiced to see My day, and he saw it and was glad."

■ John 8:57—The Jews responded: "You are not even 50 years old, and you claim you have seen Abraham?"

■ John 8:58—He said: "Before Abraham was, I AM."

■ John 8:59—When they took stones to throw at Him, He hid Himself.

Exodus 3:6 and the Sadducees

In the Gospel accounts, we read about the time when the religious leaders (including Pharisees and Sadducees) sought to entangle the Son of God (the events noted in Matthew 22, Mark 12 and Luke 20).

When He answered the Sadducees (in Matthew 22:32, Mark 12:26 and Luke 20:37), He said: "I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob."

In the presentation titled "First Commandment—Part 2," we will continue with more scriptures from both the Old and New Testaments.
