	To say that the Passover "became" a sanctuary event, means that at some point in history it was NOT a sanctuary event
	The Exodus Passover was a Domestic Event
Exod. 12:1-20 3	the Lord spoke to Moses and Aaron take for himself a lamb – according to the house of his father – a lamb for a household
6 7 11	then the whole congregation of Israel shall kill it at twilight you shall blood on the two doorposts – and on the lintel of the houses you shall eat it with a belt on your waist, your sandals on your feet and your staff in your hand
31	Pharaoh called for Moses and Aaron by night and said: Rise and go out, both you and the children of Israel
	The Passover became a "sanctuary" event – at the tabernacle
Deut. 16:1 2 5 6 7 Exod. 12:48 Num. 9:6 7	 "keep the Passover" "in the place where the Lord chooses to put His name" "you may not sacrifice the Passover within any of your gates" "but at the place where the Lord chooses to make His name abide" "you shall roast and eat it in the place which the Lord your God chooses" "let him come near and keep it" certain men became defiled – they could not keep the Passover on that day these men asked: why are we kept from presenting the offering of the Lord among the children of Israel?
·	The Passover continued as a "sanctuary" event – at the temple Notice – Hezekiah and Josiah
2 Chron. 30:26	Hezekiah – been nothing like this in Jerusalem – since time of Solomon the king, his leaders and all the assembly in Jerusalem agreed to keep the Passover in the second month

had not consecrated themselves

they brought the burnt offering to the house of the Lord
