 - An important fact of life = we are saved by the Father's grace
 - Here are some important facts of life and the Father's expectations
- 1. Our Father has expectations of us
- 2. Our Father blesses us when we follow those expectations
- 3. When we don't follow our Father's expectations often the Father bails us out
- 4. When we don't follow our Father's expectations sometimes the Father does not bail us out but lets us learn valuable lessons
- 5. When the Father does not bail us out He often teaches us to deal with adversity

Let's Look at 3 Reasons Why We Obey

1. Blessings Now

Exod. 20:1-2	since God brought them out of Egypt – 10 commandments
Deut. 30:15-16	I have set before you life and good, death and evil – love the Lord your God and walk in His ways – and the Lord will bless you
17-18	if your hearts turn away – you shall perish
19-20	choose life, that you may live – that you may love the Lord your God and obey His voice and cling to Him
Psalm 34:4	David – I sought the Lord, and He heard me – and delivered me from all my fears
17	the righteous cry out, and the Lord hears – and delivers them our of all their troubles
18	the Lord is near to those who have a broken heart – and saves such as have a contrite spirit
Psalm 119:1	blessed are the undefiled in the way – who walk in the law of the Lord
2	blessed are those who keep His testimonies – who seek Him with the whole heart
Matt. 16:5-12	leaven of Pharisees and Sadducees – their doctrine

21 the approach of the elders, chief priests and scribes

John 10:10 the thief comes to steal, to kill and to destroy – I came that they may have life, and that they might have it more abundantly

2. Blessings Later

Luke 14:12-14 and you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you – for you shall be repaid at the resurrection of the just

Here are some excerpts from a book by Max Lucado titled *And the Angels Were Silent* – from page 159 (about the concept of betrayal).

It's a weapon found only in the hands of one you love. Your enemy has no such tool – for only a friend can betray. Betrayal is mutiny. It's a violation of trust. An inside job.

Would that it were a stranger. Would that it were a random attack. Would that you were a victim of circumstances. But you aren't. You are a victim of a friend.

A sandpaper kiss is placed on your cheek. A promise is made with fingers crossed. You look to you friends and your friends don't look back. You look to the system for justice – the system looks to you as a scapegoat.

- You are betrayed. Bitten with a snake's kiss.
- It's more than rejection. Rejection opens a wound betrayal pour the salt.
- It's more than loneliness. Loneliness leaves you in the cold betrayal closes the door.
- It's more than mockery. Mockery plunges the knife betrayal twists it.
- It's more than an insult. An insult attacks your pride betrayal breaks your heart.
