The Son of God said

Luke 9:21-22 He strictly warned and commanded them to tell this to no one, saying – "The Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and be raised the third day"

Luke 18:31-33 then He took the 12 aside and said to them – "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and all things that are written by the prophets concerning the Son of Man will be accomplished. For He will be delivered to the Gentiles and will be mocked and insulted and spit upon. They will scourge Him and kill Him. And the third day He will rise again"

Luke wrote

Luke 23:50	behold, there was a man named Joseph – a council member – a good and just man
51	he had not consented to their decision and deed – (he was from Arimathea, a city of the Jews) – he was also waiting for the kingdom of God
52	this man went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus
53	Joseph (of Arimathea) – took down body – wrapped in linen – in tomb
54	that day was the preparation, and the Sabbath (the high day) drew near
56	the women returned and prepared spices and fragrant oils – they rested on
	the (weekly) Sabbath according to the commandment
Luke 24:1	first day of the week – very early in the morning – certain women came to
	the tomb, bringing spices which they prepared
2	they found the stone rolled away from the tomb
3	they went into the tomb, and did not find the body of the Lord
4-7	2 men in shining garments stood by them – "why do you seek the living
	among the dead? He is not here, but is risen! Remember how He
	spoke to you when He was still in Galilee saying 'The Son of Man
	must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified,
	and the third day rise again' "
8-10	told the 11 and the ladies
11	the words seemed like idle tales – they did not believe them
Luke 24:12	Peter arrived

13-16	2 men traveling to Emmaus – (7 miles from Jerusalem) – did not
17	recognize
17	"why are you sad?"
18	Cleopas – are you a stranger to Jerusalem?
19	Christ asked – what things?
19-24	they described what happened
25-30	He expounded to them
31	they finally recognized Him
34	"the Lord is risen"
46	He said – it was necessary for the Christ to suffer and to rise from the dead the third day"
Acts 1:22	the replacement of Judas – was to be a witness of His resurrection
Acts 4:1-2	the leaders were disturbed that the disciples preached the resurrection of the dead
33	with great power, the apostles gave witness to the resurrection of the Lord
	Peter said
Acts 2:24	whom God raised up
29	David is dead and buried
30	would raise up the Christ – to sit on his throne
31	concerning the resurrection of the Christ
32	this Jesus, God has raised up – of which we are all witnesses
33	exalted to the right hand
Acts 3:14-15	you denied the Holy One and the Just – you asked for a murderer to be released – you killed the Prince of life – whom God raised from the dead – of which we are witnesses
Acts 4:10	let it be known – this man was healed by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth (whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead)
Acts 5:30	the God of our fathers raised up Jesus (whom you murdered by hanging on a tree) – and exalted Him to His right hand to be Prince and Savior
Acts 10:39-41	the people killed Him by hanging Him on a tree – God raised up on the third day and showed Him openly – to witnesses – that He arose from the dead
1 Pet. 1:3	living hope – through the resurrection of the Son of God from the dead
21	people believe in God through the Son – God who raised the Son from the dead – and gave Him glory – so that your faith and hope are in God
1 Pet. 3:21-22	saved – through the resurrection of the Son of God – who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God – angels, authorities and power having been made subject to Him
