

## **“We Have Such a High Priest”**

- Today – We are celebrating – the Day of Atonement
- Today – Opportunity to give a Bible study
- Title – “We Have Such a High Priest”

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Heb. 8:1	here is the main point of what we are saying: “We have such a High Priest, who seated at the right hand of the throne of Majesty in the heavens”
Exodus 25-27	scriptures about the tabernacle
Exodus 28-30	scriptures about the priesthood
Heb. 2:17	in all things, he had to be made like His brethren – that He might be a merciful and faithful High Priest in things pertaining to God (to make propitiation for the sins of the people)
18	for in that He Himself has suffered (being tempted), He is able to aid those who are tempted
Heb. 3:1	therefore (holy brethren and partakers of the heavenly calling) – consider the Apostle and High Priest of our confession
Heb. 4:14	seeing then that we have a great High Priest (who has passed into the heavens, Jesus the Son of God) – let us hold fast our confession
15	we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses – but was in all points tempted as we are – yet without sin
16	therefore, let us go boldly to the throne of grace – that we may obtain mercy and find grace in time of need
Heb. 5:1-3	every high priest had to offer a sacrifice for himself
Heb. 7:11	if perfection were through the Levitical priesthood, what further need was there that another priest should arise?
12	there was a change in the priesthood – [no longer from a specific family]
13	priesthood was chosen from another tribe
14	our Lord – came from Judah
23	through the years, there were many priests
24	our priest continues forever – an unchangeable priesthood
25	He lives to make intercession for the people
26	such is a fitting High Priest Holy – Harmless – undefiled – Separate from sinners – Higher than the heavens
27	He does not need to offer up sacrifices (neither regular or special) – He offered up Himself
28	high priests have weaknesses – the Son has been perfected forever
Heb. 8:1-2	we have such a high priest
Heb. 9:1	the first covenant had ordinances of divine service & the earthly sanctuary

2 a tabernacle was prepared – lampstand, the table, the showbread – which  
 is  
     called the sanctuary  
 3 behind the second veil – the part of the tabernacle called the Holiest of All  
 4 which had the golden censor and the ark of the covenant (overlaid on all  
     sides with gold) – (1) golden pot that had the manna; (2) Aaron’s  
     rod that budded; and (3) the tablets of the covenant  
 5 above the ark – were the cherubim of glory overshadowing the mercy seat  
 6 first part of the tabernacle – priests entered  
 7 second part – the high priest alone – once a year – offering  
 8 the way into the Holiest of All was not yet made manifest while the first  
     tabernacle was standing  
 9 it was symbolic for the present time  
 10 fleshly ordinances imposed until the time of reformation  
 11-13 Christ came as High Priest of the good things to come – with the greater  
     and more perfect tabernacle  
 14 Christ offered Himself (without spot to God) – to cleanse our conscience  
     from dead works to serve the living God  
 15 He is the mediator of the new covenant – to overcome the death that was  
     established under the first covenant  
 16-17 like writing a will – the will comes into effect after a person dies  
 18-21 the first covenant was dedicated with blood  
 22 without the shedding of blood, there is no remission  
 23 it was a pattern  
 24 for Christ has not entered the holy places made with hands (which are  
     copies of the true) – but He entered into heaven itself  
 25 He didn’t offer Himself often – like the high priests entered the Most Holy  
     Place every year  
 26 but He came to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself  
 27 it is appointed for people to die once – and then comes the judgment  
 28 so Christ was offered once to bear the sins of many – to those who eagerly  
     wait for Him, He will appear a second time – apart from sin, for  
     salvation  
 Heb. 10:4 it is not possible that the blood of bulls and goats could take away sins  
 11 every priests stands ministering daily and offering repeatedly the same  
     sacrifices – which can never take away sin  
 12 but this Man (after He offered one sacrifice for sins forever) sat down at  
     the right hand of God  
 19-22 therefore, having boldness to enter the Holiest by the blood of Christ –  
     through the veil – having a High Priest  
 23-25 hold fast with hope & faith – stir up love & good works – gather together  
 Heb. 12:20-21 may the God of peace, who brought up our Lord Jesus from the dead (that  
     great Shepherd of the sheep) through the blood of the everlasting  
     covenant – make you perfect in every good work to do His will –  
     through Jesus Christ – to whom be glory forever and ever, Amen
