	· son of Jakeh – (mentioned only here)
	writing to Ithiel (twice) and Ucal (mentioned only here)
2	stupid – no understanding
2 3	no wisdom – no knowledge of the Holy One
4	admits – the magnificence of God
5-6	admits – God's words are true
7-9	(temporarily skip)
10-14	mentions problems in the world
