3	"Come, let us make bricks and bake them thoroughly" – brick for stone – asphalt for mortar		
4	"Come, let us build ourselves a city, and a tower whose top is in the heavens; let us make a name for ourselves, lest we be scattered abroad over the face of the earth"		
5	but the Lord came down to see the city and the tower which they had built		
6	"Indeed the people are one and they all have one language, and this is what		
	they begin to do; now nothing that they propose to do will be withheld from them"		
7	"Come, let Us go down and there confuse their languages, that they may not understand one another's speech"		
8	Lord scattered them abroad over face of the earth – they ceased building		
9	therefore, its name is called Babel, because the Lord confused the language of all the earth – scattered them over the face of the earth		

Josephus – Antiquities of the Jews – Chapter IV – Page 30 Concerning the Tower of Babylon, and the Confusion of Tongues

"2. Now it was Nimrod who excited them to such an affront and contempt of God. He was the grandson of Ham (the son of Noah), a bold man, and of great strength of hand.

"He persuaded them not to ascribe it to God, as if it were through his means they were happy, but to believe that it was their own courage which procured that happiness. He also gradually changed the government into tyranny – seeing no other way of turning men from fear of God, but to bring them into a constant dependence on his power.

"He also said he would be revenged on God, if he should have a mind to drown the world again; for that he would build a tower too high for the waters to reach! And that he would avenge himself on God for destroying their forefathers!

"3. Now the multitude were very ready to follow the determination of Nimrod, and to esteem it a piece of cowardice to submit to God; and they built a tower, neither sparing any pains, nor being in any degree negligent about the work; and by reason of the multitude of hands employed in it, it grew very high, sooner than any one could expect; but the thickness of it was so great, and it was so strongly built, that thereby its great height seemed, upon the view, to be less than it really was.

It was built of burnt brick, cemented together with mortar, made of bitumen, that it might not be liable to admit water.

"When God saw that they acted so madly, he did not resolve to destroy them utterly, since they were not grown wiser by the destruction of the former sinners; but he caused a tumult among them, by producing in them [diverse] languages; and causing that, through the multitude of those languages, they should not be able to understand one another.

"The place wherein they built the tower is now called Babylon; because of the confusion of that language which they readily understood before; for the Hebrews mean by the word Babel, Confusion . . ."
