  - 1. Person does not understand wicked one snatches away
  - 2. Tribulation or persecution arises person stumbles
  - 3. Cares of this world & deceitfulness of riches choke the word
  - 4. Good ground person bears fruit and produces

## 2. Tribulation or Persecution arises – person stumbles

Matt. 13:5-6

some seeds fell on stony places, where they did not have much earth – and they immediately sprang up (although they had not depth of earth) – but when the sun was up, they were scorched – and because they had no root, they withered away

20-21

he who received seed on stony places, hears the word – although he immediately receives it with joy, he has no root in himself – so when tribulation or persecution arises because of the word, he immediately stumbles

Tribulation

Greek – "thlipsis" (#2347) – noun
"trouble, distress, oppression, tribulation"
tribulation or tribulations – 21 times
affliction – 11 times
trouble – 3 times

Matt. 24:21 then there shall be great tribulation (#2347), such as has not been since the beginning of the world until this time – no, nor ever shall be

I have spoken these things to you, that you may have peace in Me – in the world, you will have tribulation (#2347) – be of good cheer, I have overcome the world

Acts 14:21-22 Paul returned to Lystra, Iconium and Antioch – strengthening the disciples

- exhorting them to continue in the faith - saying "we must through many tribulations [#2347] enter the kingdom of God 2 Cor. 1:4 who comforts us in all our tribulation (#2347), that we may be able to comfort those who are in any trouble (#2347) Persecution Greek – "diogmos" (#1375) – noun "persecution" persecution or persecutions – 10 times Greek – "dioktes" – (#1376) – noun "persecutor" persecutor – 1 time Greek – "dioko" (#1377) – verb "to pursue, persecute, systematically oppress and harass" a form of persecution -31 times other -13 times Acts 8:1 a great persecution (#1375) – arose against the church at Jerusalem the Jews stirred up the devout and prominent women – and the chief men Acts 13:50 of the city raised up persecution (#1375) against Paul and Barnabas - and expelled them from their region I take pleasure in infirmities, reproaches, needs and persecutions (#1375) 2 Cor. 12:10 for Christ's sake 1 Tim. 1:13 Paul was formerly a blasphemer and a persecutor (#1376) blessed are those who are persecuted (#1377) for righteousness sake Matt. 5:10 11 blessed are you when they revile and persecute (#1377) you – and say all kinds of evil against you falsely, for My sake they persecuted (#1377) the prophets 12 2 Tim. 3:12 all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution (#1377) Mentioning both – tribulation and persecution Rom. 8:35 shall tribulation or persecution separate you from the love of Christ? 2 Thes. 1:4 your patience & faith – in persecutions & tribulations that you endure Did you notice some roots in those last 2 verses? Love of Christ – Patience & Faith Final scripture not strange – when the fiery trial comes upon you 1 Pet. 4:12 rejoice – partaker of Christ's sufferings 13 reproached for the name of Christ 14 15-16 suffer as a Christian
