- Suicide = you doing it to yourself or you orchestrating it to happen
- We are talking about Natural, Accidental or Violent

Natural – course of nature; from natural causes (age or disease)

Phil. 1:21 to live is Christ and to die is gain

a desire to depart and to be with Christ (which is far better)

to stay alive – more needful for you

•	It is "normal" to feel exceedingly sorrowful and deeply distressed The Son of God experienced sorrow – and He committed NO sin
Matt. 26:37 38 39 Luke 22:43 John 18:37	the Son of God began to be sorrowful and deeply distressed He said: "My soul is exceedingly sorrowful, even to death" He talked to the Father an angel appeared to Him from heaven – strengthening Him for this cause I was born and for this cause I have come into the world – to bear witness to the truth
•	Biblical examples – people who have overcome strong discouragement
Num. 11:11-15 1 Kings 19:4 Job 3:1-26 Jer. 20:14-18 Jonah 4:3	Moses – "please kill me here and now" Elijah – "it is enough" – "take my life" Job – opened his mouth and cursed the day of his birth Jeremiah – "cursed be the day I was born" Jonah – "please take my life, for it is better for me to die than to live"
•	The Lord turns bad things into good
Gen. 50:20 Psalm 18:28 Isaiah 57:1	you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good You will light my lamp – the Lord my God will enlighten my darkness the righteous is taken away from evil
•	Two tremendous powers – the Spirit of the man – the Spirit of God
Psalm 8:3-8 1 Cor. 2:11	lower than angels – dominion over the physical creation the spirit of the man – the Spirit of God
•	Paul's understanding – about life and death
1 Cor. 15:18 50-54 2 Cor. 4:16 17 18 1 Thes. 4:13 16-17 2 Tim. 4:6-7 8 Phil. 1:21 23 24	"fallen asleep in Christ" corruption puts on incorruption – mortal puts on immortality outward perishes – inward is renewed daily light affliction – for a moment contrast – temporary and eternal "fallen asleep" the dead in Christ will rise first – then, those who are alive knew his death was near – good fight, finished the race, kept the faith awaiting crown of righteousness – given to all who love Lord's appearing to live is Christ and to die is gain a desire to depart and to be with Christ – (which is far better) to stay alive – more needful for you
