- * your young men shall see visions
- * I will pour out My Spirit on My menservants and and on My maidservants

Acts 2:17-18

discusses time when the following shall occur

- * I will pour out My Spirit on all flesh
- * your sons and your daughters shall prophesy
- * your young men shall see visions
- * your old men shall dream dreams
- * I will pour out My Spirit in those days on My menservants and on My maidservants -- and

they shall prophesy

- *Since all the details of Joel 2:28-32 were not fulfilled on the Day of Pentecost, what can we learn?
- * Peter used a prophecy from the Old Testament (Joel 2:28-32) in a sermon to explain events that he saw in his life (Acts 2) -- even though some of the details did not exactly apply at that moment
- * Although you should not claim to speak for God when He has not spoken to you, it is not wrong for you to recognize truth from the past to help you appreciate miracles in present
- * Please be careful not to attempt to squeeze or to force the interpretation of a general prophecy of events -- into a specific event

- *What details of Joel 2:28-29 and Acts 2:16-21 were fulfilled on the Day of Pentecost?
- * Did this prophecy come "after" Joel 2:28?
 - * Yes
- * Did this prophecy come "after" Acts 2:16-21?
 - Acts 2 -- Jewish converts
 - * Acts 10:44-48 -- Gentile converts
- *Did God pour out His Spirit upon "all flesh" either time?
 - Not literally
 - * Was the phrase "all flesh" a literary device?
- *Was there a dramatic increase in prophesying, visions and dreams after the Day of Pentecost?
 - Examples of prophesying, visions and dreams
 - * But hard to determine if there was dramatic increase
- *Were there wonders in the heavens and in the earth? * Not as specifically described in Joel 2, but yes.
 - * Mighty wind
 - * Divided tongues of fire
 - * One sat upon each of them
 - Began to speak with other tongues
- *Did the sun turn into darkness and the moon turn into blood?
 - * The book of Acts makes no reference to such
 - Either this occurred without being reported
 - * Or the phrases were a literary device
- *Were the events of Joel 2:28-32 and Acts 2:16-21 part of the great and awesome day of the Lord?
 - This was not necessarily a specific time-frame as many religious people define it
 - * The phrase "Day of the Lord" has been used in the Bible

to describe when God got more involved *Did whoever called on the name of the Lord on the Day of Pentecost become saved at that time?

Well, 3,000 people were baptized

*What details of Joel 2:28-32 and Acts 2:16:21 were fulfilled in the New Testament?

- * Some events of Acts 2:16-21 occurred during the rest of the New Testament
- * Some events of Acts 2:16-21 are expected during the time of the book of Revelation
- * Some events of Acts 2:16-21 are expected during the time preceding the return of Christ

- *What is the primary time-frame of Joel 2:28-32 and Acts 2:16-21 describing the prophesying, visions and dreams?
- 1. Proceeding forward from Joel 2:28-32
 - Prophesying, visions & dreams in the Old Testament
- 2. Proceeding forward from Acts 2:16-21
 - * Prophesying, visions & dreams in the New Testament
 - * Miracles of the apostolic age
 - * Continued today
- 3. Primarily, preceding the return of Christ
 - * Viewing many prophecies as End-Time events
 - * Viewing book of Revelation as End-Time book
 - * Miracles will increase near the return of Christ
- 4. Primarily, in the millennium
 - Expecting miracles to increase in millennium
