Acts 15:40 Acts 16:1-3 4-5 6 7 8 9-10 11-12 13 14-15	Paul chose Silas Paul wanted Timothy to join them through the cities churches strengthened forbidden by Holy Spirit to preach in Asia the Spirit did not permit them Bithynia went to Troas Paul had a vision to go to Macedonia ended up in Philippi Sabbath day met with the women Lydia and her household baptized

17 18 19	there was a slave girl who had the spirit of divination her masters much profit by her divination she followed proclaiming things about them Paul cast out the spirit her masters became upset when they saw that their was gone dragged them before the magistrates the masters accused them before the magistrate the multitude rose up against them and the magistrates commanded that Paul and Silas be beaten with rods after beating them, Paul and Silas were throw into prison the keeper of the jail was instructed to keep them securely so he put them into the inner prison & fastened their feet in the stocks

Acts 16:25 26 27 28 29-34	midnight praying and singing hymns a great earthquake opened the prison doors and loosened the prisoners' chains the keeper of the prison assumed the prisoners had escaped and he was going to kill himsel: Paul comforted the keeper of the prison Paul baptized the keeper of the prison & family	

* Paul's national rights

Acts 16:35	in the morning, the magistrates sent officers to the keeper of the prison with the message to
36	release Paul and Silas the keeper of the prison relayed the message to Paul and Silas
37	when Paul heard the message, Paul said
	 * They have been beaten us openly (innocent Romans citizens) * They have thrown us into prison
	* Now, the magistrates want us to go away secretly (quietly)
	* No indeed Let them come here themselves and let us out
38	and when the officers told these words to the magistrates, they were afraid when they heard that Paul and Silas were Roman citizens
39	the magistrates came and pleaded with them and brought them out and asked them to leave the city
40	Paul and Silas went to Lydia's house and saw the brethren they were encouraged (who was encouraged? probably all the brethren)
	* A later episode
Acts 22:1-21 22	Paul was giving his testimony they said "Away with such a fellow from the earth, for he is not fit to live"
23	they tore off their clothes and threw dust into the air
24	commander ordered that Paul be brought back to the barracks & be examined by scourging wanting to learn why they said such things against him
25	Paul is it lawful for you to scourge a man who is a Roman, an innocent Roman?
26	centurion told the commander be careful what you do, because this man is a Roman [with rights]
27 28	commander asked are you a Roman? commander so am I; I obtained my citizenship with a large sum of money Paul said I was born a citizen
29	those who were about to examine him withdrew from him the commander was also afraid after he discovered that he had bound up a Roman citizen
