*Before we read the letter, let's notice 3 important sections of scripture about the apostle Paul

people treat yo	1.2 Timothy 4:14-15 Paul understood the reality of watching how
2 Tim. 4:14	Paul recognized the evil works of Alexander the coppersmith he said, "the Lord reward
15	him according to his works" Paul warned Timothy
	2.Acts 15:36-40 Paul had experience with having difficulty to re-establish trust with a co-worker (Notice the story of John Mark)
Acts 12:12 25 Acts 13:4-5	Mary the mother of John Mark Barnabas and Saul took John Mark with them when Barnabas and Paul traveled together, John Mark went with them later, John Mark left them
Acts 15:36 37 38 previously left	later, Paul and Barnabas discussed traveling together again Barnabas wanted to take John Mark with them Paul did not like that idea because John Mark had them
39-40 Col. 4:10 Philemon 24	contention separate travels Paul mentioned Marcus Paul mentioned Marcus Paul mentioned Mark

3.Romans 12:17-21

Paul wrote about the concept of dealing with evil and of being a peacemaker

Rom.	12 : 17	not repay evil for evil
	18	seek peace whenever possible
	19-20	avoid revenge
	21	overcome evil with good

Notice the main people in the letter Paul author of letter verse 1 Philemon verse 1 wealthy slave-owner a beloved lady -- wife of Philemon? Apphia verse 2 son of Philemon -- (and Apphia?) Archippus verse 2 runaway slave -- who was desiring to Onesimus verse 10 return to his master 4 parts of the letter Philemon 1-7 appreciation for Philemon and family 8-16 Paul's petition for Onesimus 17 - 21Paul's promise to Philemon 22-25 conclusion Paul was a prisoner (in Rome) -- 1 of 4 prison epistles Philemon 1 (also -- Ephesians, Philippians Colossians) -- friend of Philemon Apphia and Archippus -- church in their home Col. 4:17 Archippus -- servant in the Lord Philemon 3 greeting to the family their kindness to believers 5 - 78-9 Paul began his appeal to his friend 10 Onesimus -- became a believer during his time with Paul 11 Onesimus -- was previously unprofitable to Philemon (probably a thief and definitely a runaway slave) -- became profitable to Paul 12 Onesimus -- obligation to return to Philemon 13 - 14Paul wanted Onesimus to remain with him -- but he did not want to violate his relation-ship with Philemon 15-16 although Onesimus departed for a while, he returned as a "brother" 17 "if you count me as a partner, receive him as myself" 18 "if he has wronged you, put it on my account" 19 "I will repay it" 20-21 "cheer me up by doing this for me" prepare lodging for me 22
