a false witness will not go unpunished – he who speaks lies will not escape Prov. 19:5

a false witness will not go unpunished – he who speaks lies shall perish

hand for hand, foot for foot"

Matt. 5:38

the Son of God - "You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth."

39-42

"But I tell you not to resist an evil person. But whoever slaps you on your right cheek, turn the other to him also. If anyone wants to sue you and take away your tunic, let him have your cloak also. And whoever compels you to go one mile, go with him two. Give to him who asks you and from him who wants to borrow from you, do not turn away."

Assuredly, I say to you, you will be no means get out of there until you have paid the last penny."
Matt. 10:16	wise as serpents and harmless as doves
17	beware of men – deliver you up to councils – scourge you in synagogues
18	brought before governors and kings for My sake
	t your sword in its place, for all who take the sword will perish by the sword. Or do you think that I cannot now pray to My Father, and He will provide Me with more than 12 legions of angels"
Mark 14:47	one drew his sword and cut off an ear

Acts 7:51-60	Stephen – before the council (6:12) & the high priest (7:1)
	Various examples of the apostle Paul
Acts 16:16-21	the masters of the slave girl – took Paul & Silas to the magistrates
22	the magistrates commanded that Paul & Silas be beaten with rods
23-25	in prison
35-40	national rights
Acts 22:22-24	scourging
25-29	national rights
Acts 23:1-5	Paul addressing the council (addressing religious leaders)
3	Paul said – "God will strike you"
5	Paul said – "I did not know that he was the high priest"
Rom. 13:1-5	be subject to governing authorities – to avoid wrath – for conscience' sake
1 Cor. 6:1-8	why are you taking your brother to court? – before unbelievers!
5	aren't any of you wise enough to judge between brethren?
6	brother goes to law against brother – and that before unbelievers!
7	an utter failure to go to law against one another – why do you not accept wrong? – why do you not let yourselves be cheated?
